











PennEnvironment



100% Renewable Energy Lobby Day

- 100% Renewable Energy Lobby Day, Harrisburg, PA.- Attended by PennEnvironment staf, volunteers, and over 400 concerned citizens.
- Among the attendees were religious leaders, business owners, health professionals, local and state legislators, and children.
 Lobbying for support of HB 1425 in the House and SB 630 in the Senate.
 HB1425/SB630 would require the Commonwealth to achieve 100%
- renewable energy by 2050. - FIVE new cosponsors signed on, bringing the total to 95 cosponsors! (the bill has 103 now)
- First of its kind to have bipartisan support
 Met with 90 legislative of ces and dropped by 70.



Drink Philly Tap Project





- Partnership with Philadelphia Water Department
- Talk with residents about water use and plastic consumption at local farmers markets, public parks, and free events.
- Main Goals: Increase trust in public drinking water, reduce single use plastic bottles, educate consumers on the f nancial costs of drinking bottled water instead of tap water.
- Aim: Collect 10,000 pledges from Philadelphia residents between May and August.
- Collected: 6,000 by August 22, 2019

Letter Writing Party

- July Letter writing party in Bethlehem, PA
- 14 members of the community attended
- Educated and informed community members about how to write letters to their elected of cials and to their local newspapers
- Discussed the importance and influence of these actions
- During my internship I wrote six letters to the editor, four of which were published in local newspapers; The Morning Call, The Pocono Record, and The Scranton Times-Tribune.
- I also co-authored an op-ed that was published in the Pocono Record.

Clean Energy Expo





- August Clean Energy Expo at DeSales University
- Promoted renewable energy solutions for the Lehigh Valley
- Featured 20 local clean energy suppliers such as wind, solar, geothermal, and environmental groups
- Featured four electric vehicles from Tesla and BMW
- Appearance by Congresswoman Susan Wild, who cosponsored HR-9, The Climate Action Now Act, which reconfirms the United State's Commitment to the Paris Climate Agreement
- Panel discussion on Our Clean Energy Future featuring State Representative Steve Samuelson, and other environmental experts and
- religious leaders - Over 90 Lehigh Valley residents attended!
